Single-Stream RECYCLING

Blue Bin



Paper & Cardboard

- Clean & Dry
- Flat cardboard
- Coffee cups with **no liquid**



Glass

- Food-grade (no porcelain or ceramic)
- Best to reuse or take to SARCAN



Metal

- Clean household tin and aluminum
- Paper can be left on cans



Plastic

- #1-7 plastics
- No plastic bags, film, toys, or black plastic
- No caps or lids

Black Bin



Organic Waste

- Food waste
- Contaminated items
- Soiled paper or tissue



Plastic Bags & Film

- Grocery bags
- Cling wrap and packaging
- If it stretches, it's garbage



Small Materials

- Smaller than a credit card
- Plastic Cutlery
- Confetti paper



Styrofoam

- #6 plastic, but is **not recyclable**

Batteries & Small Electronics

- Can go in red electronics bins around campus
- Map available at site below



Hazardous Waste

- Household Hazardous Waste days (saskatoon.ca)
- McEown Park residents have Friday pickups (garbage room)



Large Electronics

- London Drugs will take most large electronics for recycling free of charge



Lightbulbs & Windows

- CFL (swirly) bulbs are hazardous waste
- Windows, mirrors, porcelain, and ceramic must go to the landfill
